Mayor Woerther thanked Director of Public Works Rick Brown, Director of Planning Joe Vujnich and City Administrator Ryan Thomas for their participation.

April 5, 2016 Municipal Election Unofficial Results

Mayor Woerther stated that although the results were not official, he wanted to congratulate all Candidates regardless of whether they ran opposed and unopposed.

Planning and Zoning Commission Appointment ~ Ed Kohn, Ward 3 – Filling Unexpired Term ending June 2016

Mayor Woerther asked the City Council to approve his recommendation to appoint Mr. Ed Kohn to the Planning and Zoning Commission to fill the unexpired term ending June 2016. A motion was made by Council Member Baugus, seconded by Council Member Cullinane, to approve the Mayor's recommendation to appoint Mr. Ed Kohn to the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Ms. Barbara Sprenger, 84 Strecker Road, spoke regarding the EPA's intention to delist the Callahan site and stated that once it is delisted, we won't be able to get it back on.

Ms. Mary Morton, 211 Strecker Farms Ct., asked for clarification on the increase to Dr. deFur and stated there may be a conflict in asking Mr. Morrison about the legal options for delisting the Callahan site.

PUBLIC HEARING(S)

(Postponed at the January 11, 2016 City Council Meeting – to remain postponed)

A response to a communication from Jenny Mitchell, Director of Property Management for the Desco Group, which is dated October 20, 2015, regarding St. Louis County's P.C. 219-85 Alfred L. Hicks and J.L. Mason of Missouri, Inc.; Amended MXD Mixed-Use Development District; south side of Manchester Road, east of Old Fairway Drive (Street Address: 16506 Manchester Road/Locator Number: 23U120480); seeking modifications to an existing site-specific ordinance that governs the Schnucks Wildwood Crossing Center to allow for a third freestanding monument sign along the property's Manchester Road frontage. (Ward - Seven)

P.Z. 3-16 City of Wildwood Planning and Zoning Commission c/o Department of Planning, 16860 Main Street, Wildwood, Missouri – A request to endorse and ratify the Planning and Zoning Commission's action upon the 2016 update of the City of Wildwood's Master Plan. The City's Charter requires this plan to be updated every ten (10) years, and was last updated in 2006. The updated Master Plan was reviewed by the Master Plan Advisory Committee (MPAC) from January 2015 to February 2016 and its members acted favorably upon it and submitted its recommendation to the Planning and Zoning Commission for its consideration. The Planning and Zoning Commission reviewed the updated Master Plan and acted favorably to adopt this draft. The Master Plan establishes goals, objectives, and policies for the protection of the environment, application of planning techniques for land use and development purposes, allocation of resources and services, prioritization of transportation and infrastructure improvements, provision of public space and recreational amenities within the community, and economic development. Along with these goals, objectives, and policies, the Master Plan establishes types and densities/intensities of land use for every parcel of ground within the boundaries of the City of Wildwood. Additionally, the City's Charter requires the conceptual land use changes in the Master Plan to be reviewed and adopted by City Council, which serves as Wildwood's Comprehensive Zoning Plan. (Wards – All)

Mayor Woerther opened the public hearing. Deputy City Clerk Rehtin read the public hearing into the record.

Director of Planning and Parks Vujnich reviewed the background of the Master Plan Update process and the letter of recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Discussion was held regarding the following: two main changes highlighted are economic development and land use; two potential changes were endorsed by the Planning and Zoning Commission; will the change to BP open up commercial development on Highway 109; no, that is only related to that particular site specific ordinance; Committee did a great job of debating; original Master Plan was so great, it didn't need radical changes.

A motion was made by Council Member McGowen, seconded by Council Member DeHart, to authorize the Department of Planning to prepare legislation to adopt the land use changes as acted upon by the Planning and Zoning Commission. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

P.Z. 24-14 Centaur Station, (Michael Phelan), 18833 Cliffview Lane, Wildwood, Missouri, 63005 c/o Department of Planning, City of Wildwood, Missouri, 16860 Main Street, Wildwood, Missouri 63040– A request, in response to a communication from Michael Phelan, which is dated October 16, 2015, regarding P.Z. 24-14 Centaur Station, noting his intent to not proceed with the placement of the historic building on the City's registry, thereby seeking the revocation of the Landmark and Preservation Area (LPA) that was approved by the City Council on December 8, 2014, and governs these two (2) tracts of land; west side of Centaur Road, north of Wild Horse Creek Road (Locator Numbers: 19X410082 and 19Y620026/Street Addresses: 107 and 109 Centaur Road); Landmark and Preservation Area (LPA) in the Floodplain Non-Urban Residence District. (Ward – One)

Mayor Woerther opened the public hearing. Deputy City Clerk Rehtin read the public hearing into the record.

Director of Planning and Parks Vujnich reviewed the request from the petitioner and the letter of recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission. Director of Planning and Parks Vujnich stated the request was seeking the revocation of the Landmark and Preservation Area (LPA) that was approved by the City Council in 2014. Director of Planning and Parks Vujnich stated the Commission believed the application of this special procedure permit is now not appropriate at this location and should be revoked, given the circumstances associated with its approval. Director of Planning and Parks Vujnich stated the Planning and Zoning Commission was recommending the City Council act to remove the Landmark and Preservation Area (LPA) from this site, which would return its allowable uses to those activities that are prescribed in the City's FPNU Floodplain Non-Urban Residence District.

Discussion was held regarding the following: how would this relate to the Master Plan change; the Master Plan land use for this property did not change; what steps do we need to take on this; need legislation revoking the LPA.

A motion was made by Council Member McGowen, seconded by Council Member DeHart, to authorize the Department of Planning to prepare legislation revoking the Landmark Preservation Area. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

MAYOR'S COMMENTS/ANNOUNCEMENTS/APPOINTMENTS - None

CITY ADMINISTRATOR DISCUSSION ITEMS

Request for Building Permit Authorization – 18634 Hawks Trail Drive (Ward – Six)

Director of Planning Vujnich gave a brief overview of the previous discussion regarding this issue. Director of Planning Vujnich reviewed the options discussed and agreed upon by the City Council. Director of Planning Vujnich stated a draft letter was drafted for future buyers regarding the requirements. Director of Planning Vujnich stated the draft letter was being presented tonight for City Council comments and approval.

A motion was made by Council Member Bowlin, seconded by Council Member Porter, for final action and approval of the letter. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

Consultant Contract with Environmental Stewardship Concepts (Wards – Two and Four)

City Administrator Thomas mentioned there was a Resolution on the agenda for a new cap on the contract. City Administrator Thomas stated it was unknown to what extent the City would use this firm in the future.

Discussion was held regarding the following: do we have a list of what kinds of work he will be completing for these fees; asked him to provide a list of potential tasks and cost estimates for those; Staff can keep Council updated on expenses as they occur; want him to document what he will be doing and what reports he will provide to Council; don't think we should raise the number until we know what we are going to ask him to do; the reason why the Resolution was brought forward tonight is because he has reached his cap so we need to address it at this time; doesn't have to be \$20,000.00; need some type of authorization to raise the amount for him to finish the report and from there we can choose what we want to utilize him for; who can we ask about our legal options so EPA does not delist the Callahan site; think retaining Mr. Morrison on this matter would be an appropriate place to begin; concerned about voting on something open-ended, is there a cap on it; think we should do a little investigation before we decide who does it and once we decide we would know the rates; are we having comments made and submitted in writing for that; the City already sent a letter stating our opposition to the delisting; feel uncomfortable bumping it that high, maybe do just \$10,000 and then try to understand what some of the other duties would be.

A motion was made by Council Member Manton, seconded by Council Member Stine, to request our legal counsel to explore options in regards to the delisting of the Callahan site. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

Monthly Successor Connection Reports from Ameren Missouri (Wards – All)

City Administrator Thomas stated there was a Bill on the agenda to consider this item. City Administrator Thomas stated the monthly report of new residents and new businesses is helpful to the City for sending out welcome packages.

Farmers Market Report for Upcoming 2016 Season (Wards – All)

Director of Planning and Parks Vujnich stated there was a Bill on the agenda for consideration regarding the Farmers Market Managers' agreement for the 2016 season.

Discussion was held regarding the following: the base stipend remains unchanged; there was an increase of approximately \$250 for training, conferences, and advertising; the fees charged to vendors is to remain unchanged; the duties and responsibilities remain unchanged for the City and the managers; the City Attorney has reviewed the contract; there were some shared expenses in previous years because they were the managers of Ellisville Farmers Market but they are not this year.

COMMITTEE ACTION ITEM(S)/RECOMMENDATION(S)

Update on Rural Internet Access Project (Wards – All)

Director of Planning and Parks Vujnich noted a memorandum had been provided for the City Council's review and that he was available to answer any questions they may have regarding the Rural Internet Access Project. Director of Planning and Parks Vujnich stated the Department of Planning was requesting direction from the City Council on Charter Communication.

Discussion was held regarding the following: where is BaysET through all of this; BaysET continues to sign customers each month; would like to send a letter to the County Executive about how we can get their support with getting access to these emergency towers; seems to me that the only way we could ever enter into an agreement with Charter or anybody would be if there was some sort of recoupment mechanism; we need to put the pressure on the county; the homeowners were the ones who didn't want the lighted pole so they don't have the service; maybe try to get ahold of someone on the board (ECC Boards); the Department of Planning can prepare draft letters; the Charter side seems to be a dead issue; no one is in favor of going back to Charter.

Historic Preservation Commission

Historic Community Marker Program Update (Wards – All)

Director of Planning and Parks Vujnich noted a memorandum had been provided for the City Council's review and that he was available to answer any questions they may have regarding the Historic Community Marker Program. Director of Planning and Parks Vujnich noted the next two (2) installations occurred just a couple of weeks ago and included the Monarch and Westland Acres Communities.
